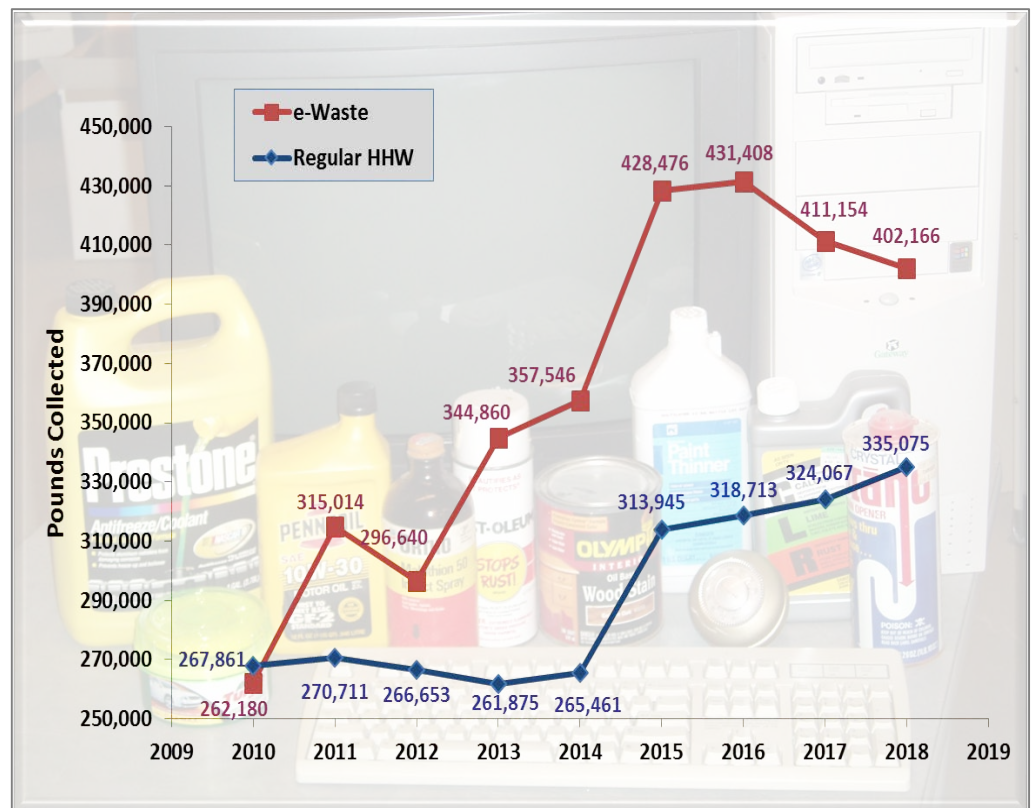

## HHW Center By the Numbers

Year:	2017	2018	Increase
Participants:	13,260	13,699	3%
Chemicals:	324,067	335,075	3%
Electronics:	411,154	402,166	-2%

For two years in a row, we saw a slight drop in the pounds of electronics collected while participation and pounds of chemicals collected continue to rise. In 2017, 22,000 pounds of pesticides were destroyed and in 2018 over 23,000 pounds.

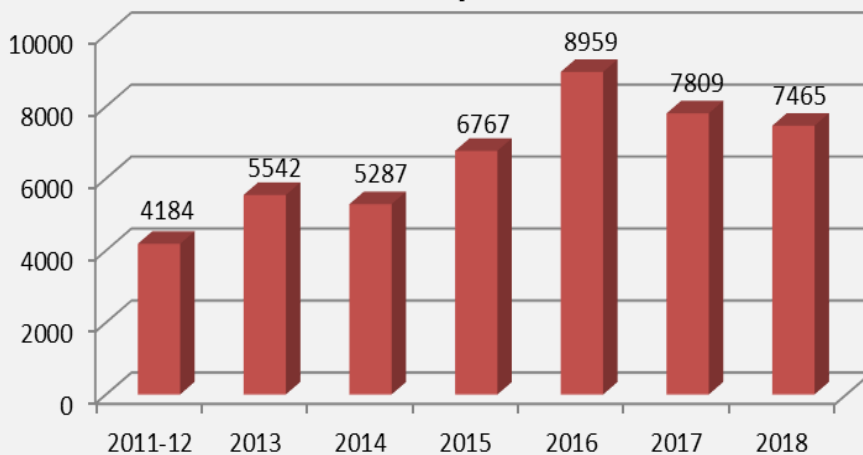
