

Cooper Fire Department held two training sessions in the month of June. The Firefighters trained on Incident Command and Confined Space in the 1<sup>st</sup> drill and ladders and nozzle flow testing during the 2<sup>nd</sup> drill. There were 62 calls for service this month bringing the year-to-date total to 406, just below last year at this time. The department is on track to have one of its busiest years in the department's history.

In June, one of the department's newest members was cleared to operate some of the emergency vehicles. This process included many hours of training with the apparatus and driving procedures. This month many of the department's members have stepped up to help in a few different work groups. Some of the work groups are intended to determine if there is a need to upgrade certain equipment and facilities, then research what would be best suited. Other work groups are set up to determine the department's training needs and if there needs to be a change to the staffing levels and how firefighters respond to incidents.
